BEDS Plus provides nutritionally balanced meals (6,300) and a safe, warm bed (2,500) to an average of 150 individuals from October 15th to April 30th each season. In addition to meeting these basic needs, BEDS provides comprehensive Case Management and an opportunity for each client to participate in an assortment of managed programs. It is through Case Management that BEDS is able to develop with the client an individualized goal plan and referrals with the outcome goals of financial improvement and housing. BEDS also provides year round Case Management Services in its administrative offices. In early 2011, BEDS will also open a new 5 day a week daytime support center to give homeless clients in their Case Management program increased access to Case Managers, support groups, health services, and employment skills programs.
